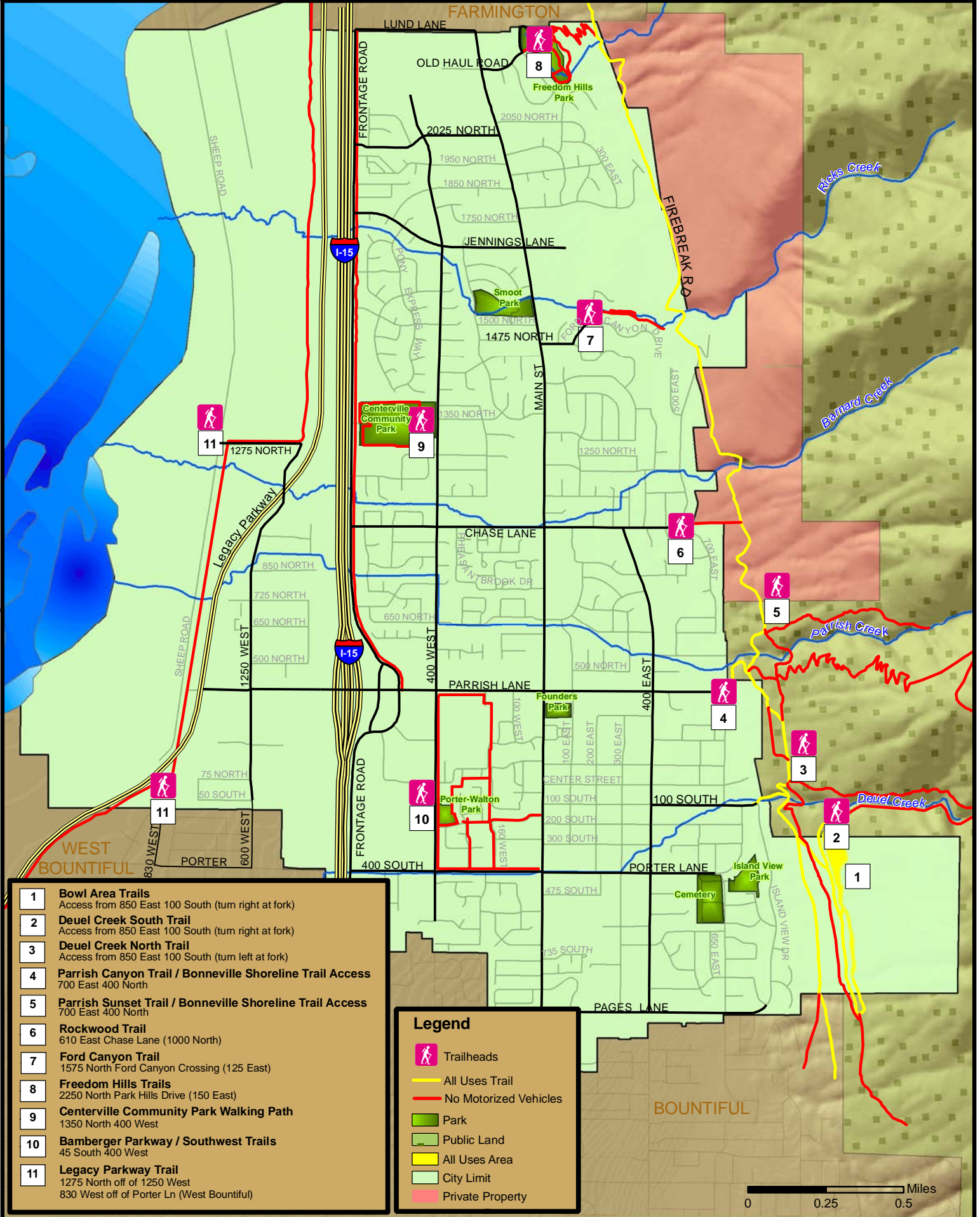




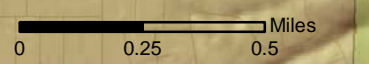
CENTERVILLE PARKS AND TRAILS

Welcome to the trails of Centerville! Centerville's unique location offers access to many trails and pathways into the Wasatch Mountains while urban trails throughout our community offer a different experience. The Centerville Trails Committee has developed this map showing each trail and walking path in our city to facilitate your use and enjoyment.

Trail Descriptions

- 1. Bowl Area Trails:** This is an open space area of dirt and rock used by ATV's and hikers, approximately 0.2 mile long, with rolling hills around its perimeter.
- 2. Deuel Creek South Trail:** This trail begins at the north end of the bowl area. It is marked by a kiosk at the trailhead. This trail follows Deuel Creek, crossing several small, rustic, log bridges. The trail traverses rocky terrain and passes an unusual waterfall. This trail connects with the Deuel Creek North trail.
- 3. Deuel Creek North Trail:** A kiosk marks the start of this trail, just off the Fire Break road. It begins with a fairly steep climb. The trail levels and passes a campsite, then descends to the creek side and continues up the canyon where it merges with the Deuel Creek South trail.
- 4. Parrish Canyon Trail / Bonneville Shoreline Trail Access:** From the kiosk at the trailhead, several switchbacks provide a steady climb of about 2,500 feet without becoming too steep. About 3 miles up, the trail reaches Centerville Peak. From the peak the trail continues another 3 miles to Skyline Road.
- 5. Parrish Sunset Trail:** This trailhead is just off the Fire Break road about 300 yards north of the Parrish Canyon Trail parking area. The trail is approximately 0.75 mile long and fairly steep. The trail is exposed to direct sun until the very end, thus providing incredible views of the Great Salt Lake, Antelope Island and gorgeous sunsets.
- 6. Rockwood Trail:** This trail is 0.2 mile of relatively steep terrain. It connects to the Fire Break road.
- 7. Ford Canyon Trail:** This trail is a family-friendly half-mile loop with two bridges that cross Ricks Creek. There is a picnic area with two tables and plenty of shade.
- 8. Freedom Hills Trails:** Freedom Hills Park is circled by two paved walking path loops of 0.4 mile each that interconnect in various places. The switchback trail climbs the face of the mountain for half a mile before linking with the Fire Break road. The northeast side of the park provides access to an equestrian trail that travels up the Farmington hillside. A staging area and horse trailer parking are available.
- 9. Centerville Community Park Walking Path:** A marker at the southeast corner of the park gives directions to complete a "Gold Medal Mile" along the paved path around the perimeter of the park. A one-mile compass course also begins at this marker.
- 10. Bamberger Parkway / Southwest Trails:** This urban trail is a network of pavement and sidewalks. There are informational kiosks describing the historic Bamberger railroad. These trails connect the surrounding neighborhoods with shopping, the Centerville library and Porter-Walton Park.
- 11. Legacy Parkway Trail:** Cyclists and pedestrians share this paved trail that parallels the Legacy Parkway from Farmington to North Salt Lake. Scenic views include striking mountains, farmland, wildlife and migratory birds.

Helpful Reminders

Please help us keep our trails clean by picking up trash. If you have a pet, please keep it on a leash, and be prepared to clean up after your pet. Many trails border privately-owned property. Please be courteous and stay off private property. Always hike with a friend, bring plenty of water, and let someone know where you will be.
